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CCSU Guidelines and Information for Families Around Online Learning with Students

Many of our educators may be using different tools for online learning. These include video conferencing tools from Google and Zoom to connect with students. This is intended to maintain relationships and check-in. Teachers may also ask students to record themselves for some assignments using tools from WeVideo and FlipGrid. These are only examples of tools that may be used; it is possible that teachers may use others.

- Teachers will be notifying families whether they intend to use video conferencing or assignment recording tools. If families for any reason are not comfortable with their child participating, families should let the teacher(s) know that they **choose not** to have their child participate.
- Students in our preK-8 buildings do not have the ability to start one of these meetings using Hangouts/Meet, but they can join one that their teacher creates. They may be able to create a Zoom meeting if they go in and create their own account.

We know that some parents/guardians may use these or other video conferencing tools for your own remote work. Thus, you may be familiar with some important elements. We would like to provide everyone with information to consider while students participate in these online sessions.

Expectations for those who join these sessions:

- Please be dressed for school
- Attend from an appropriate place: kitchen table, desk, common area, etc. (not sitting on your bed or walking around the house, etc)
- A place with good lighting is helpful.
- Headphones are a good option to help hear the conversations better. Headphones with a built-in microphone can help to prevent the possibility of unwanted audio being picked up from the background.

- Consider who else might be at home and how to ensure that your child can focus on the video conference session without interruption or distractions, if possible.
- Teachers will be mindful of the time of day during which these are scheduled and they will try to be consistent to accommodate for your schedules as well.
- There may be **no 1:1 video sessions between teachers and students** except in the case of special ed services or if the parent is present with the child. Teachers will reach out directly if that is needed.

Joining a video conference:

- Teachers will share a link that students will access either via their school-provided email account, their calendar or Google Classroom
- Students should join from their school issued device. If they were not issued a device they may choose to use a personal device. If they are using a tablet or phone, it is likely that you will need to add the app.
